California Required Organics Recycling



What is it?

All businesses throughout the state are required to subscribe to an organics recycling service (which includes both food waste and green waste collection) as required by Senate Bill 1383. Organic waste material includes items such as food waste, food-soiled paper, green waste/lawn clippings, and clean wood.

SB 1383's intent is to reduce organic materials going to the landfill, decreasing greenhouse gas emissions. This helps you, your employees, and your tenants.

What do I need to do?

Subscribe to sufficient organics services and educate and train employees and tenants to sort food scraps and food-soiled paper properly.

Sign up for organics collection service. WM offers free onsite or virtual visits, assessments and technical assistance to help you set up your service needs for the size of your property. Even if you have a landscaper managing green waste, you still must sign up for food waste recycling. Carts and bins are available in various sizes depending on the amount of waste your property generates.
